For fresh and radiant skin

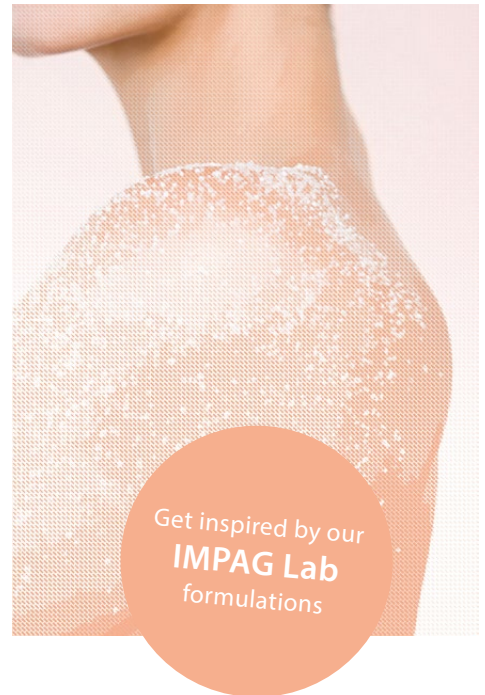

Once released into the environment, they can absorb various kinds of toxins before being eaten by fish and other aquatic organisms. The particles thus make their way into the entire food chain, all the way up to humans.

Example materials of synthetic scrub particles are polyethylene (PE), polypropylene (PP) and polyethylene terephthalate (PET).
